



# Today's air cargo **processes** are not optimal and have **not improved** in 30 years

Estimated average end-to-end (shipper to consignee) air cargo transportation time = ~ 5.5 days


Effective time in the air: from a few hours up to 20 hours..

"Ninety per cent of the transit time for air cargo is spent not moving, but waiting to move!" (Air Cargo News 11.03.2013)

73rd IATA Annual General Meeting Resolution on Cargo Modernization

and Industry Transformation

Recognizes the TFA as an instrument that promotes enhanced international trade through simplification of border management complexities whilst promoting the enhanced use of technology by customs administrations including the provision of advanced air cargo information to facilitate effective supply-chain security compliance.

Calls on governments to implement, at the earliest opportunity, the provisions of the WTO TFA to facilitate a reduction in border transactional costs.

# WHAT IS TRADE FACILITATION?

Measurements aimed at promoting international trade by expediting the movement, release and clearance of goods.

THE TRADE FACILITATION AGREEMENT (TFA)



In force since 22 February 2017 121 parties (and growing)







# AIR CARGO ON THE TFA



covers the release and clearance of goods, including topics such as risk management and authorized operators for customs issues.



Perishable goods



aims to simplify formalities such as document requirements and common border procedures.

# Some expected direct impact of the UCC


- Security: PLACI + re-vamped ENS/EXS will have to be in place by 2020-2025 (ICS2) => intro of multiple filing, new data elements (HS codes), inclusion of Mail
- Economic operators need to re-apply for authorizations to EU simplifications (e.g. use of cargo manifests as Electronic Transit Document by May 2018)



# EU AEO expected simplifications under UCC

- Easier admittance to customs simplifications
- Fewer physical and document-based controls
- Prior notification in case of selection for physical control (related to safety and security)
- Prior notification in case of selection for customs control
- Priority treatment if selected for control
- Possibility to request a specific place for customs controls
- Mutual Recognition with third countries
